News Network supports freedom of speech and expression, democracy and human rights, good governance, transparency, gender equality and independent media



News Network envisions a nation where citizens are aware of their rights, enjoy freedom of expression, dignity of life and gender equality, and where the media is free.

The organization is committed to promoting democracy, freedom of expression and press, diversity for peace, human rights, access to information and justice, and inclusion of marginalized and ethnic people.

Its efforts focus on enhancing the digital security and physical safety of social actors, supporting media development, strengthening journalists' skills, and empowering human rights defenders (HRDs) to uphold democratic values. Additionally, News Network advocates for civil society engagement in policy planning and socio-economic development. As well as it encourages and empowers women to pursue careers in journalism.

A group of young journalists, media and communication experts, and human rights activists established News Network in June 1994, with a view to bringing social change and empowering the people. It was officially registered by the government in 1995 in accordance with the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Act. As a result of its significant efforts, the organization was granted Special Consultative Status by the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) in 2022. Also, it has been accolated the status of an Associate of the United Nations Department of Global Communications (DGC) in 2024. The organisation has strong ties to media outlets, journalists, and civil society organisations (CSOs) around the nation.

## Works and Success

News Network maintains a robust nationwide network of CSOs and media outlets. Over the years, it has been experienced with extensive knowledge and expertise to carry out diversified activities in cities to remote areas.

Since launching of its first project in 1995, funded by the Ford Foundation to support investigative journalism, News Network has

expanded its activities significantly in the field of training, research, investigative reporting and promoting women in journalism. With support from national and international donors, as of December 2024 it has successfully implemented over 40 projects throughout the country, demonstrating its sustainable impact on journalism, media development, and human rights.

Strengthening media freedom is one of the core initiatives of News Network. In order to achieve the goal it has undertaken several actions which included, among others, training up and sensitising about 5000 journalists and media gatekeepers including editors, executive editors and news editors on various issues. The issues included a range of topics such as ethical practices of journalism, digital security and legal safety, information accuracy, in-depth and investigative reporting, election reporting, covering news from danger zones, and fighting hate speech, misinformation, as well as the fake news.

The organisation also provided month-long fellowship to new comers in journalism profession. News Network activities cover almost all divisional cities and districts.

Over the last two decades, the organisation has been offering month-long to year-long fellowships in practical journalism to young women in an effort to encourage them to choose journalism as a career. Until now about 500 young women have been benefited from this fellowship. One of its objectives is to promote gender equality in the nation's heavily male-dominated media industry. The initiative has greatly helped to break the social taboos. At present, a good number of News Network fellows are well positioned in mainstream regional and national print and electronic media. Moreover, it helped the media organisations to change its traditional mind set and encourage hiring more female journalists.

The organisation strongly upholds its commitment and extends supports to promote human rights, democratic values and other rights based issues. And subsequently, it helps to promote human rights defenders' (HRDs') capacity building. The actions are well aimed to sensitise and train up HRDs on risk assessment, case investigation, advocacy campaign and lobbying for public interest issues and civic engagement in socio-economic development initiatives.

In the VIEW of rapid digital transformation, News Network is worried about the physical and digital safety of journalists and HRDs. To face the challenges, it has undertaken various activities for better understanding and increasing their skills on digital safety and security. These will make them skilled to protect their communication tools from unauthorised access and help them ensure safe communication and data verification

and transfer, as well as countering misinformation, disinformation, mal information, fake news and hate speech. The organization is also working for enhancing knowledge and capacity of journalists to promote and protect freedom of speech and press and face the new challenges posed by 21st century technological change

News Network is also concerned about the safety and security of media personnel in accordance with the 'UN Plan of Action on the Safety of Journalists and the Issue of Impunity'. As a result, it promotes justice for crime against journalists, rule of law and reduce impunity. Feeling worried by amplifying concerns about the safety of journalists and HRDs, the organisation actively pushes for accountability within the justice system. It counters the challenges, works to bolster protections for those at risk, creating a safer environment for journalists to carry out their work without fear.

### **Development Partners**

### **Governance structure**

News Network is governed by a 7-member Executive Council (EC). The EC consists of President, Vice- President, Secretary General, Finance Secretay and three Executive Members. The EC's main respobilites include making policies, providing advices and suggestions as well as

undertaking major diceisions to run the office and activities smoothly. The body is democratically elected by a 21-member General Council (GC) every four years. On behalf of EC, the Secretary General plays a vital role and acts as the Editor and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of News Network.
